laine Wilmore has made a major contribution to the preparation of school principals with this book. Since the development of the 1983 American Association of School Administrators (AASA) Guidelines for the Preparation of School Administrators, several organizations have extended and modified the seven competencies into standards for the preparation and professional development of school leaders. Fenwick English and Betty Steffy collaborated with me in Skills for Successful 21st Century School Leaders (1998) to synthesize the key standards, skills, dispositions, input and outcome measures, and instructional strategies included in standards by the AASA, Educational Leadership Constituent Council (ELCC), National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), National Policy Board for Educational Administration (NPBEA), and the Interstate School Leaders Licensure (ISLLC). In 2001, the ELCC, composed of selected individuals representing AASA, AACTE, ASCD, CCSSO, NAESP, NASSP, NCPEA, and UCEA, revised standards for Advanced Programs in Educational Leadership and presented them to the Specialty Areas Study Board (SASB) of NCATE. These new ELCC standards for principals, superintendents, and other central office administrators were drawn from ISLLC, AASA, and NCATE standards for the position of superintendent and other central office administrators. They represent the latest collaboration of professional associations to establish the vital elements to judge the quality of preparation programs for school leaders.
