

FIVE TIPS FOR #FORMATIVETECH

Find a baseline: Use a tool like Padlet.com to create an online KWL. Students can post what they know about a topic and you can identify any misconceptions.

Gauge interest: Create a survey using Kahoot to find out what your students are interested in learning more about before starting a new unit.

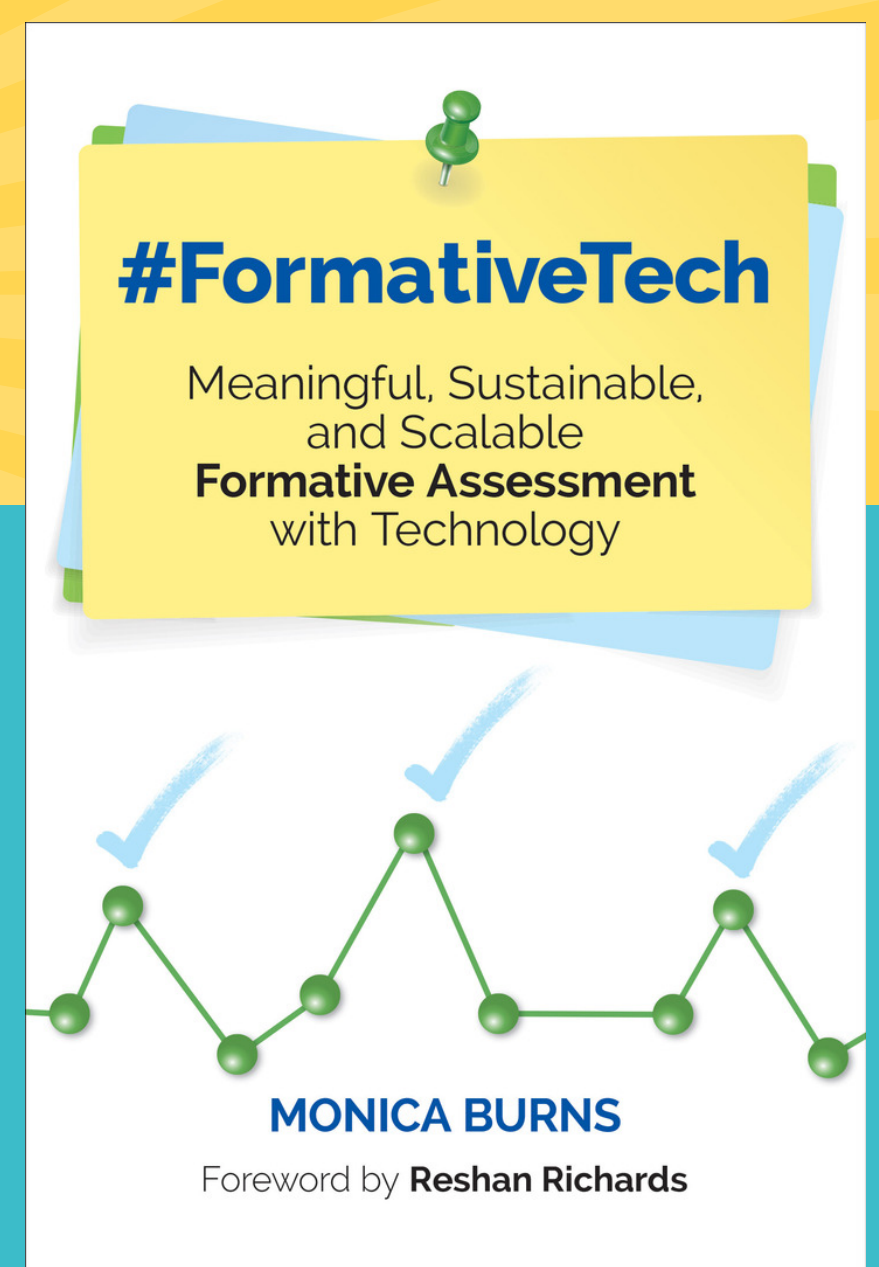
Create a backchannel: Next time you watch a video clip with your class use a backchannel like Today's Meet. Students can post questions so you can see what they find confusing about a new concept.

Listen to voices: A screencasting tool like Explain Everything can give you a window into student thinking. Students can show what they know and you can listen in.

Embed questions: With an interactive tool like Nearpod you can add questions into a presentation to check for understanding during a lesson.
